

Comprehensive Distance Learning FAQ's for Riley Creek School

Is attendance required?

Yes. Teachers will take attendance, and students will need to be in attendance at their assigned time.

What if my child needs to be absent?

Call the office. Absences for illness and appointments can still be excused by a parent. In addition, please email your student's teacher (or have your student email their teachers for secondary). Recordings of classes will be available within 24 hours.

Will student work be graded?

Yes. Work policies will be set by the teachers for their individual classrooms. All work is expected to be completed digitally (unless other arrangements are made), submitted on-time, complete, and labeled correctly.

What if my student needs help?

Communicate directly via email or phone with your child's teacher. The teachers are available via phone, email and Remind from 7:45 until 3:45 every day. The expectation is that students are doing their work during the school day when they can access help. If you need other accommodations, contact your teacher and the building administrator.

What if I don't have a computer/wi-fi access?

The district has equipment available for loan. Laptops can be requested through the office in each building, and there are a limited number of cellular hotspots that the district has available for loan. Contact the building administrator regarding borrowing one of these devices.

When will we return to school?

As soon as possible. We are working from a model that we will return to school when state and local metrics allow for it. We will be working closely with our local health authority to determine whether the current situation allows for a return to face-to-face learning. The district will give a three-week notice regarding a return to in-person instruction.

Can I work online all year?

Yes. The district has setup an online only option, and you can register for it via the front office of your school. We are asking that students who choose this option agree to a set period of time in which they will work online only. Students may only change in or out of online learning at the quarterly grading periods.

What will school look like when we come back?

Similar but with health precautions. Central Curry School District is committed to providing every child a high-quality, appropriate and safe education. When we return to school, expectations will be adjusted to meet current COVID-19 related mandates and best practices. Specific information regarding topics such as: social distancing, PPE and working in smaller cohorts, will be issued at that time. We all want to be back together, but safety has to be our first priority.
